Glossary of Terms

Need Based aid

Based on the parent and student income

Merit Based Aid

 Based on student's talent in academics, music, art, sports, etc.

EFC

Estimated Family Contribution (<u>calculator</u>)

CSS Profile

 Most common application for international students seeking any kind of financial aid

FAFSA

Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (US Citizens only)

Self Reported

 When a student/parent reports data that is unsubstantiated by an external source

Loan

 A sum of money that needs to be paid back over a period of time

• Grant, scholarship, bursary

 A sum of money that does not need to be paid back





Types of Financial Aid

Need based - Merit based
Typical discount rate of 20%-50%
Housing is usually not covered
FAFSA for US Citizens

If you are not planning on applying for Financial Aid, plan on full "cost of attendance" plus 10% in your bank account to get a student visa.



Exchange Programs and Study Abroad

Exchange programs operate on a 1:1 ration exchange so students pay home school fees. This means a student studying at Thammasat University or HKUST could apply, be accepted and go to King's College or Columbia University for the same cost of attendance.

Consider airfare, insurance, cost of living.

Community College in the US

Save money on two years tuition

Matriculating into a 2 year community college is becoming more and more popular. Those who need academic English, more time to mature, or simply wish to save money.

Many have guaranteed transfer options such as Washington, California and Florida. Tuition is anywhere from 5,000 to 10,000 USD per year - significant savings for a degree from an institution such as UCLA, University of Washington or Florida State.

Community colleges are one of America's great social inventions a gateway to the future for first time students looking for an affordable college education.

Form a Strategy

- Financial availability MUST be the first priority. This will dictate subsequent decisions.
- Need-based vs merit-based: What is going to affect the admissions outcome? Adjust accordingly.
- Merit-based scholarships are all around us!
- Consider a range of geographical locations.
- Gap Year: Opportunity for growth and student finances
- Application deadlines (globally) can be an advantage. "Try, try, try again..."
